A UNIQUE LEARNING EXPERIENCE

The specialized child care program at **NEBRASKA CHILDREN’S HOME SOCIETY** teaches children appropriate behavioral skills. The program has two critical elements, *Model of Care* and *Family Component*. The focus of this program is to:

- Prepare children for school
- Improve academic, social and life skills
- Provide families with helpful parenting information

MODEL OF CARE

Our “model of care” incorporates the use of researched child care practices in a structured learning environment. Staff members are highly-trained professionals focused on teaching age-appropriate academic, social and life skills – ultimately striving for each child to be successful at home, at school and in the community.

FAMILY COMPONENT

Parental involvement is a requirement for children participating in the child care program at **NEBRASKA CHILDREN’S HOME**. Staff encourages parents and caregivers to enhance their child’s specialized child care experience by attending regular progress meetings and offering an opportunity to preview upcoming activities.
