WHAT SHOULD YOU CONSIDER?

PARENTING Parenting is the hardest, most demanding job you'll ever undertake. It means being responsible for the care and nurture of a child for at least 18 years. It requires dedication, patience, and sacrifice. It can also bring with it rewards: the warmth of cuddling with a baby; proudly watching as a toddler takes a first step, or tearfully putting your little one on a school bus for the first time!

Still, there are options available to you other than single parenting. One of them is adoption.
